

The Sweet Eats family kitchen itself is progressing and we are hoping to get all of the cabinets and countertops in by the middle of January. We are working out a contract for coffee service as well. We are still working with the hospital to figure out how to bring in fresh food items that are not frozen, and they are supposed to come to some decision soon. Families will only be able to bring in homemade meals to the hospital directly to other families and not place them in The Sweet Eats Family Kitchen. So we are thinking we will create a "sponsor family" program, where outside families can sponsor a hospitalized family and bring homemade meals directly to them as often as they would like.

We are also negotiating with the hospital to be able to display our photography. We have acquired over 50 comments from parents that have children with cancer, and patients themselves, stating that they actually like the photographs, they make them feel "more at home", "more normal", and "not alone". There is a misconception that photographs of other children will create fear in newly diagnosed cancer patients and their parents. We have seen quite the opposite response from teens and parents in all stages of treatment (without a single negative comment). There is no medical research out there to support this fear. It appears the medical community (myself included), still have some learning to do on this subject.
