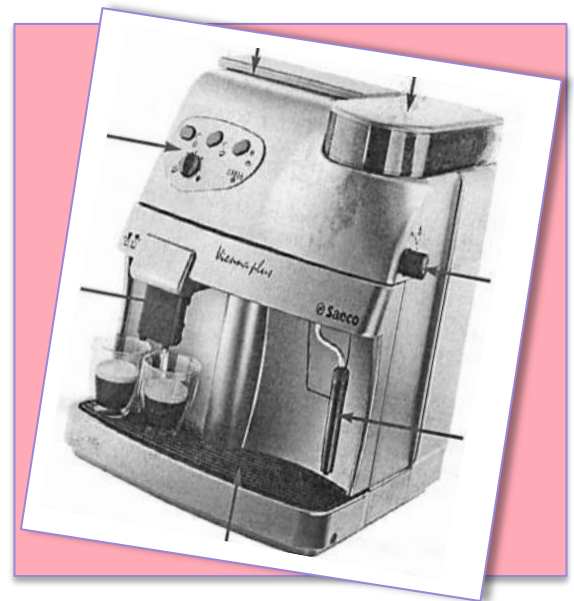

This great coffee machine for parents will grind fresh beans for each and every cup...to help wake them up after those hard nights.



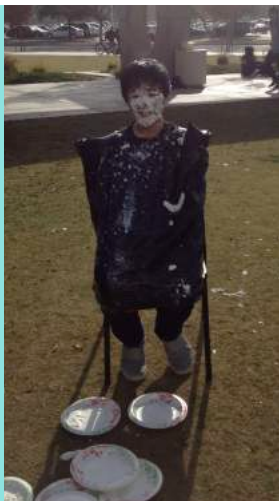
